

## **STAYING CONNECTED**

Associations like the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) and the American Legion offer local events for veterans. You can arrange informal get-togethers for your military buddies and their families. You can also organize reunions with individuals or other families you have met and befriended while you served in the military, traveling together as families for vacations or reconnecting at a central place for a gathering.
